Why engage and work with the community?

Responds to community needs and cultural diversity to embed a culture of inclusion and high-expectations for all.

- Engaging and working with the community is most effective when:
- There are high aspirations for learning that inspire staff, students and the community.
- School leaders develop a mutually supportive, collaborative and trusting relationship with the community to ensure engagement with the life of the school.
- There is effective communication, negotiation, collaboration and advocacy.
- School leaders relate well to all members of the school's community.
- Specific strategies are created for hard-to-reach parents and carers.



What does high-impact practice look like?

Responding to culture and community, developing strong relationships, inspiring and challenging others, and managing difficult situations and conversations.

Exploring the use of technology to deepen the engagement of parents and carers in student learning.

Creating a positive learning atmosphere for students and staff as part of the wider community.

Things to consider:

- High-performing leaders consistently demonstrate sophisticated personal and interpersonal qualities.
- Leaders are responsive and flexible in the fast-changing and increasingly complex circumstances of the community environment.
- Effective leaders use educational expertise and management skills to create a school culture in which all learners make progress and achieve.
