Facts about Northern Territory

- The Northern Territory is the third-largest federal division in Australia and spans a vast area of 1,347,791 square kilometres boasting a diverse terrain that includes a tropical climate in the north, a desert climate in the far south, and significant landmarks such as Uluru and Kata Tuja.
- As of December 2023, the Northern Territory is home to over 253,000 residents with a significant number of people identifying as Aboriginal and/ or Torres Strait Islander. A large proportion of the population live within the capital city area of Greater Darwin.
- The Northern Territory is renowned for the worldfamous Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park, Kakadu National Park, Litchfield National Park, and the culturally rich Arnhem Land.
- The education sector in the Northern Territory has a total of 194 schools as of 2023, comprising a mix of Government (77.8%), Catholic (9.3%), and Independent (12.9%) institutions.
