



HALT Certification

Highly Accomplished and Lead Teacher (HALT) certification, is an Australia-wide recognised approach to support teachers to progress their careers while remaining in the classroom, where they can have the greatest impact on student learning. Being certified equips HALTs with an understanding of their own impactin leading improvements in teaching and learning within and beyond their schools.

What is national certification?

Highly Accomplished and Lead Teacher (HALT) certification demonstrates leadership and commitment to excellence in teaching. It can help teachers progress professionally and gain valuable recognition for their skills, while allowing them to continue teaching. HALT certification is a rigorous and transparent process that recognises expert teaching practice. Certification is voluntary and portable, providing teachers across Australia with a recognised way to have their expertise acknowledged at any stage of their career.

The certification process enables teachers to receive feedback on their professional practice and have their practice evaluated. Teachers who are pursuing HALT certification can gain exposure to communities of practice supporting them to further develop and grow as professionals while improving outcomes for students.

The <u>Australian Professional Standards for Teachers</u> underpins the certification process and supports teachers to explore and expand their professional practice at the Highly Accomplished or Lead career stages.

How do I get certified?

HALT certification is available in all states and territories, with access depending on the systems and sectors where a certifying authority is in place. To find out if certification is available in your context, contact the certifying authority in your state or territory.

They will be able to provide you with details specific to your circumstances including:

- timeframes for the application process
- costs involved
- support available to applicants.

Assessment of Highly Accomplished or Lead practice

Certification assessment is made against the Highly Accomplished or Lead career stages of the Australian Professional Standards for Teachers (Teacher Standards). The achievement of certification is based on multiple sources of evidence against the Teacher Standards.

Assessment is an 'on-balance' judgement made by the certifying authority of demonstrated achievement of each of the 7 Teacher Standards. This means that the judgement is made after considering all the relevant evidence provided and involves weighing different aspects and making a judgement based on the overall assessment rather than focusing on a single factor.
